EASTER SUNDAY OF THE RESURRECTION OF THE LORD

Sunday 21 April 2019 at 10.30 a.m.

Entrance Chant *Psalm 138*

As the bell is rung, all stand as the choir sings the Entrance Chant:

Resurréxi, et adhuc tecum sum,
allelúja: posuísti super me manum
tuam, allelúja: mirábilis facta est
sciéntia tua, allelúja, allelúja. Ps.
Dómine, probásti me, et
cognovísti me: tu cognovísti
sessiónem meam, et
resurrectiónem meam. Glória
Patri. Resurréxi.

*I arose and am still with thee,
alleluia: Thou hast laid Thy hand
upon me, alleluia; Thy knowledge is
become wonderful, alleluia, alleluia.
Ps. Lord, Thou hast searched me,
and known me; Thou knowest my
sitting down and my rising up. Glory
be. I arose.*

During the Easter season the Penitential Act is replaced by the Rite for Sprinkling of Water. After the greeting, the Priest introduces the rite and as the people are sprinkled all sing Vidi Aquam, found on the orange card. After the concluding prayer the hymn Gloria in excelsis is sung by all.

Collect

O God, who on this day, through your Only Begotten Son, have conquered death and unlocked for us the path to eternity, grant, we pray, that we who keep the solemnity of the Lord's Resurrection may, through the renewal brought by your Spirit, rise up in the light of life. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. **Amen.**

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

First Reading *Acts 10:34a, 37-43*

In those days: Peter opened his mouth and said, "You know the word which was proclaimed throughout all Judea, beginning from Galilee after the baptism which John preached: how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power; how he went about doing good and healing all that were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. And we are witnesses to all that he did both in the country of the Jews and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree; but God raised him on the third day and made him manifest; not to all people but to us who were chosen by God as witnesses, who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. And he commanded us to preach to the people, and to testify that he is the one ordained by God to be judge of the living and the dead. To him all the prophets bear witness that every one who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name."

Gradual *Psalm 117 (sung by the choir)*

*Hæc dies quam fecit Dóminus:
exultémus et lætémur in ea.
Confitémini Dómino, quóniam
bonus: quóniam in sæculum
misericórdia ejus.*

*This is the day which the Lord hath
made: let us rejoice and be glad in
it. Give praise unto the Lord, for He
is good: for His mercy endureth for
ever.*

Second Reading *1 Corinthians 5:6b-8*

Do you not know that a little leaven leavens all the dough? Cleanse out the old leaven that you may be new dough, as you really are unleavened. For Christ, our Paschal Lamb, has been sacrificed. Let us, therefore, celebrate the festival, not with the old leaven, the leaven of malice and evil, but with the unleavened bread of sincerity and truth.

Alleluia *1 Corinthians 5:7 (sung by the choir)*

Allelúia, allelúia. Páscha nostrum
immolátus est Christus.

*Alleluia, alleluia. Christ, our Paschal
Lamb, has been sacrificed.*

Sequence *(sung by the choir)*

Victímæ pascháli laudes ímmolent
Christiáni. Agnus redémit oves:
Christus ínnocens Patri
reconciliávit peccatóres. Mors et
vita duéllo confluxére mirándo:
Dux vitæ mórtuus, regnat vivus.

*Christians! to the Paschal Victim
offer your praises. The Lamb the
sheep redeemeth: Christ, sinless,
reconcileth sinners to the Father.
Death and life contended in that
conflict stupendous: The Prince of*

Dic nobis, María, quid vidísti in via?
Sepúlchrum Christi vivéntis: et
glóriam vidi resurgéntis, Angélicos
testes, sudárium et vestes. Surréxit
Christus spes mea: præcédet vos
in Galilæam. Scimus Christum
surrexísse a mórtuis vere: tu
nobis, victor Rex, miserére. Amen.
Allelúia.

*Life, Who died, reigneth alive. Speak to
us, Mary, what thou sawest on your
way? "The tomb of Christ who now
liveth: and likewise the glory of the
Risen. Angels attesting, the shroud and
napkin resting. Christ my hope is
arisen: to Galilee He goeth before
you." We know that Christ is risen
truly from the dead: have mercy on
us, Thou Victor King. Amen. Alleluia.*

Gospel *John 20:1-9*

On the first day of the week, Mary Magdalene came to the tomb early, while it was still dark, and saw that the stone had been taken away from the tomb. So she ran, and went to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one whom Jesus loved, and said them, "They have taken the Lord out of the tomb, and we do not know where they have laid him." Peter then came out with the other disciple, and they went toward the tomb. They both ran, but the other disciple outran Peter and reached the tomb first; and stopping to look in, he saw the linen cloths lying there, but he did not go in. Then Simon Peter came, following him, and went into the tomb; he saw the linen cloths lying, and the napkin, which had been on his head, not lying with the linen cloths but rolled up in a place by itself. Then the other disciple, who reached the tomb first, also went in, and he saw and believed; for as yet they did not know the Scripture, that he must rise from the dead.

We sit for the homily. On Easter Sunday, in place of the Creed, we make The Renewal of Baptismal Promises. All stand, holding lighted candles in their hands, and answer the questions posed by the Priest with, I do.

THE LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST

During the preparation of the altar, all are seated.

Offertory Chant *Psalm 75 (sung by the choir)*

Terra trémuit et quiévit, dum
resúrgeret in iudício Deus, allelúia.

*The earth trembled and was still
when God arose in judgment,
alleluia.*

As needed, this hymn is then sung by all:

**Come, ye faithful, raise the strain
Of triumphant gladness;
God hath brought his Israel
Into joy from sadness;
Loosed from Pharaoh's
bitter yoke**

**Jacob's sons and daughters;
Led them with unmoistened foot
Through the Red Sea waters.**

**'Tis the spring of souls today;
Christ hath burst his prison,
And from three days' sleep in death
As a sun hath risen;
All the winter of our sins,
Long and dark, is flying
From his light, to whom we give
Laud and praise undying.**

**Now the queen of seasons, bright
With the day of splendour,
With the royal feast of feasts,
Comes its joy to render;
Comes to glad Jerusalem,
Who with true affection
Welcomes in unwearied strains
Jesus' Resurrection.**

**Neither might the gates of death,
Nor the tomb's dark portal,
Nor the watchers, nor the seal,
Hold thee as a mortal:
But today amidst thine own
Thou didst stand, bestowing
That thy peace which evermore
Passeth human knowing.**

After the preparation of the altar with the bread and wine, the gifts are honoured with incense. Then the Priest invites the people to pray, and all reply **May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands, for the praise and glory of his name, for our good and the good of all his holy Church.** *The Priest then sings the Prayer over the Offerings.*

Prayer over the Offerings

Exultant with paschal gladness, O Lord, we offer the sacrifice by which your Church is wondrously reborn and nourished. Through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Then the Preface of the Eucharistic Prayer is begun by the Priest. This concludes with the Sanctus, which can be found on the orange card.

THE COMMUNION RITE

Then follows the Our Father and the Agnus Dei, which can also be found on the purple card. During the distribution of Holy Communion, the following chant is sung by the choir.

Communion Chant *1 Corinthians 5: 7-8*

Pascha nostrum immolatus est
Christus, allelúja: itaque epulémur
in ázymis sinceritátis et veritátis,
allelúia, allelúia, allelúia.

*Christ our Pasch is immolated,
alleluia: therefore let us feast with
the unleavened bread of sincerity
and truth, alleluia, alleluia, alleluia.*

After Holy Communion, as necessary, all sing:

**Jesus Christ is risen to-day, Alleluya!
Our triumphant holy day, Alleluya!
Who did once, upon the Cross, Alleluya!
Suffer to redeem our loss. Alleluya!**

**Hymns of praise then let us sing, Alleluya!
Unto Christ, our heavenly King, Alleluya!
Who endured the Cross and grave, Alleluya!
Sinners to redeem and save. Alleluya!**

**But the pains which he endured, Alleluya!
Our salvation have procured; Alleluya!
Now above the sky he's King, Alleluya!
Where the angels ever sing. Alleluya!**

Prayer after Communion

Look upon your Church, O God, with unfailing love and favour, so that, renewed by the paschal mysteries, she may come to the glory of the resurrection. Through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

At the end of the Mass we honour the Blessed Virgin Mary by singing the Anthem appointed for this season of the year, Regina Cæli.

Rite of Blessing & Sprinkling Water replaces the usual *Penitential Rite* during the Sung Mass on Sundays during the season of Easter. This is a weekly reminder of the importance of being faithful to the promises we have made to Christ and His Church in baptism.

Major Grant Awarded Thanks to the *Living Our Faith* fund, Holy Family has been awarded £28,500. This will be used to develop a large space, to include admin and other facilities to support the growing activities of our parish. *The Parish Mission Hub* will be located at the back of the hall, and work has begun to have this ready for after Easter. This is a great opportunity, and another concrete step from maintenance to mission!

Marriage Preparation Course We are pleased to be hosting a *SmartLoving* Marriage Preparation Course, starting on 14 May. This is a 7 week course presented by married couples who act as mentors, and run by the *Marriage and Family Life* office of the diocese.
